My favourite niece, daughter to my cousin, is a cheeky and witty little girl but equally intelligent. She is very keen especially when she goes to Sunday school, and the stories that the Sunday school teachers tell them are always readily re-told to any ear willing to listen, and some times acted even to an unwilling audience. I visited them one Sunday and asked her what they learnt at Sunday school that morning and she replied that the lesson was about when Jesus went to a wedding and turned water into wine. I inquired what she learnt from the story and after some thoughtful moment, she answered. "Uncle brother, If you're planning on having a wedding, make sure Jesus is there!" and she bolted out to play with her peers.

That to me was a very profound spiritual and theological advice from a kid who was barely five at the time! It is a good thing to have Jesus at our wedding ceremonies if they are to last; indeed it is good to have Jesus everywhere and in everything that is of significance in our lives!
