
As I start this letter, February with its hot days is passing, thankfully, so far, no fire. I hope this continues. Veld fires are a great danger at this time and we need prayer to keep Volmoed safe. We hope to have a new pump in the next few days (hopefully this will be in place when this letter goes out), but this was an expense that we had not budgeted for. A strong reliable pump is necessary for not just water for the houses, but water for fire-fighting. Please keep Volmoed in your prayers. The basic infrastructure is old and we seem to be replacing everything at the moment. It is maybe a reminder of the cycle of life and the need for renewal. Volmoed is going through its own processes. We celebrate the years of service which give rise to the emergence of the new. I guess that we will always be in the eternal dance between the old and the new. Now we start lent and again we draw close to the terrible cross in the expectation of the resurrection. I wax lyrical, but it is no fun coping with the wear and tear of life, as most of us know! Still, apart from praying for resources to keep Volmoed beautiful, I am also experiencing the gratitude of being cared for by God. Thank you and the many souls whom God uses to bless us all at Volmoed.

In this lent we start to work through the covenant of love. This is another step towards work on what it means to be an intentional community. In these tough times, we need to build community as a priority. This is where Volmoed has an opportunity to rise to the high calling in Jesus and become more and more what it is. (Yes, I know that it sounds Irish, but hopefully you know what I mean. No offense to the Irish amongst us!) The covenant is a strange instrument. It is not a law. It is a guideline of love that can be a nudge to us in all we do. In this way it puts some flesh towards the vision of healing and reconciliation. The importance of this in these dark times is crucial. However, this is not a magical process. It will need to be covered in prayer. I invite you to participate in this process as we attempt to make this an inclusive process. We will be having a season of prayer and fasting before our Lord Jesus as we seek God's face for Volmoed, SA and the world during these difficult and wonderful times. We will start these on Wednesday 21st February. You are welcome to join us or join from where you are. Volmoed is more and more becoming a space of healing and reconciliation and we want to be in step with God's heart. (That sentence sounds quite presumptuous, doesn't it? Not intended to be so).

Let me just write about fundraising, because it is one of those thorny subjects. Mother Theresa of the Sisters of Charity regarded begging as a necessary discipline. Many of us are not as comfortable about asking for assistance, but one of the Volmoed Community told me that asking for an investment should be seen as normal, important and very natural. It is part of building partnerships and being a community of faith. On the other hand, I have always had a problem with people who have that miserable look on their face and come with long dubious stories of woe. When it comes to asking about money, to this day it is not something I relish, although I recognize that this is often just sharing in the responsibility of our shared Volmoed. Please pray that as I have started the Volmoed fundraising group at Volmoed that we will be given wisdom and favour in our work. If you are on of those who could contribute their wisdom please come forward. Soon we will be setting the fundraising targets for the year.

At this time of lent, we lean into our vulnerability and we draw near to Jesus Christ crucified. We experience our commonality with all humanity as we stand in awe of the love that is so great that although we are weak, yet we are strong. Have a great month.
